



# Provider-Led Arkansas Shared Savings Entity **PASSE Program**

The goal of the PASSE Program is to meet beneficiaries' health care needs, promote independence, and help keep people in their homes by providing home and community-based services.

## What is the PASSE Program?

The PASSE program serves Medicaid beneficiaries with complex behavioral health needs or intellectual and developmental disabilities.



## What Services can be provided?

The PASSE organizations coordinate all physical health, behavioral health, and specialized developmental disability services for enrolled Medicaid beneficiaries which include the following:

-  **Medical Care**
-  **Home & Community Based Services**
-  **Pharmacy**
-  **Facility-Based Services**

## What are the Four PASSEs in Arkansas?

There are four organizations in Arkansas that follow the PASSE model.

1. Arkansas Total Care
2. Care Source PASSE
3. Empower Healthcare Solutions
4. Summit Community Care

## What are the eligibility requirements?

Once enrolled in Medicaid, some beneficiaries are placed into the PASSE program. Medicaid beneficiaries are enrolled in the PASSE if they:

- Receive services through the Community and Employment Support (CES) waiver OR
- Receive services through the CES waiver wait list and receives Medicaid state plan services OR
- Live in a private Intermediate Care Facility for individuals with I/DD OR
- Have a behavioral health diagnosis and need services in addition to counseling and medication management.

Note: All PASSE members must require at least one home and community-based service.
